- The Open Meetings Act (State Law) does not allow City Commission to deliberate or respond without posting of the subject matter.
- The mayor may reduce the time for comments
- Please provide the City Secretary, prior to the meeting, any material you would like to share with the City Commission
- Persons speaking on the same topic are encouraged to appoint one spokesperson to speak on behalf of the group.
- Many comments are protected as free speech, not all expressed views are protected by any legal immunity or privilege. Consequently, any slanderous comments made during the meeting may subject the citizen to civil liability.
- The Mayor or Presiding Official may prohibit public comments if the comments are obscene, disorderly, disruptive, irrelevant, repetitive, interrupt, or impair the Mayor or Presiding Official from conducting an orderly meeting.
- Matters under litigation may not to be addressed and comments regarding specific City employees, staff, and elected officials may be prohibited.
- Once the Public Comments agenda item is closed, all testimony on a public hearing agenda item will be limited to that specific agenda item.
- All remarks on any item on the agenda, except Public Comments, will be reserved and made at the time of public hearing for that specific agenda item.
- Once the City Commission has proceeded to the agenda item following Public Comments, individuals will only be recognized during that public hearing agenda item.
